

# MIDDLE ROAD HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

ERIE STATION ROAD TO LEHIGH STATION ROAD TOWN OF HENRIETTA, MONROE COUNTY, NEW YORK



## **PROJECT NEEDS**

Improve pavement surface condition by resurfacing travel lanes

Widen paved shoulder to enhance accommodation of cyclists and pedestrians

Correct drainage and roadside safety deficiencies

Upgrade wheelchair ramps for ADA compliance

## **Project Limits**

Erie Station Road to Lehigh Station Road (1.3 miles)

## **Proposed Improvements**

- 1 ½ 2 inches of existing asphalt pavement will be milled off. Two layers of new asphalt will be placed over the milled pavement.
- New 6-foot-wide paved shoulders will be constructed along both sides of the road.
- Some utility poles will be relocated further away from edge of pavement.
- Roadside drainage will be improved throughout the corridor.
- New roadside guide rail will be installed at the large culvert south of the NYS Thruway (I-90). The guide rail along the NYS Thruway bridge approaches will be removed and replaced.
- Two wheelchair ramps on the south side of the intersection of Middle Rd and Lehigh Station Rd will be replaced to comply with ADA standards.
- Driveway aprons will be replaced.

#### **Pavement Width**

- Existing Pavement Width: Varies 26-28' (Two 11' lanes with 2'-3' shoulders)
- Proposed Pavement Width: 34' (Two 11' lanes with 6' shoulders
- Please see back of this sheet for typical sections.

### **Special Coordination**

- Relocation of utilities with temporary interruptions.
- Some easements are needed to construct improvements. Impacted property owners will be contacted by the County in the future.
- Mailboxes will be moved back to new edge of shoulder.

### **Work Zone Traffic Control**

- Travel lane shifts maintaining two-way traffic to be utilized for most work
- Temporary lane and shoulder closures with flagger control as necessary
- Access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction

### **Tentative Schedule & Costs**


- Utility Relocations: Winter/Spring 2023
- Start Construction: Spring 2023
- End Construction: Fall 2023
- Estimated Construction Costs: \$3.5 Million
- Project Funded 100% by Monroe County
