Reduce stormwater pollution by educating the public on actions they can take to protect local water quality. The Stormwater Coalition's public education program includes the H2O Hero mass media campaign (print, billboard, and Facebook/Instagram advertisements), social media, website, and direct engagement such as classroom and community presentations using a watershed model.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

In 2022, the Stormwater Coalition contracted with the Rochester Museum & Science Center (RMSC) to conduct stormwater public education including school and community presentations, and storm drain marking. The Coalition contracted with Causewave to implement the H2O Hero campaign. The campaign included a \$44,000 media buy (static and video Facebook Ads, billboards,) several new static and video digital Ads were developed for use on Instagram. The H2O Hero website received 36,079 page views during this period. The Facebook page currently has 1374 followers. The Instagram platform was also utilized with over 300,000 impressions in 2022. Coalition supported exhibits are still in place at the RMSC, Seneca Park Zoo, and Ontario Beach Robach Center. An H2O Hero billboard was purchased at Frontier Field, the home of the Rochester Redwings baseball team. A 15 educational video also runs each game. Game attendance averages 6,100 per game with a season total of 432,580 for the 2022 season.

In addition, there were five (5) mobile hazardous waste collections were held at municipalities. In 2022, the Ecopark was used by over 55,000 residents for household hazardous waste. Over 405 tons of household hazardous waste was collected and diverted as well as over 7,800 lbs of pharmaceutical waste.
